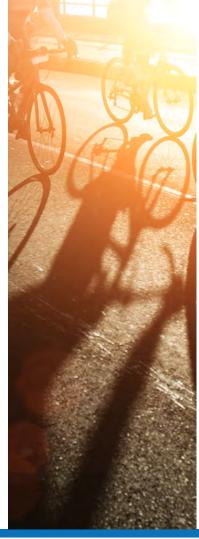

Overview

Hourly, zero-emission bus service between UC Davis main campus and UCD Medical Center

- Free to UC Davis staff and students
- Jointly operated by Yolobus and SacRT




History

- Expires May 3, 2023
- Battery-electric buses (Proterra) and chargers (Electrify America)
- Federal CMAQ grant pays other half for now
- Service launched in July 2020
 - O Hourly instead of 30 min due to COVID
 - O Savings will allow for service to continue









What's Next?

- Approve MOU to extend service for 2 years, through May 2025
- SacRT board will also take action tonight
- Seek long-term, stable source of funding
 - O State/federal formula funds
 - O Toll revenue from future express lanes on I-80

What is a Transit Center?


- Transfer point
- Close to key destinations
- Multimodal connections





Current Status of County Fair Mall

- Most stores are vacant
- Inadequate lighting at night
- Poorly-maintained



Concerns with County Fair Mall as Transit Center

- Safety concerns
- Few passenger amenities
- Not close to key destinations
- Lack of sidewalks and bike lanes








Work to Date

- August 23rd, 2018, contract for Woodland Transit Center study was initiated with Kimley Horn
- Scope was to develop an <u>Off-Street</u> Transit Center in downtown Woodland
- Draft final report in Nov 2019 was never finalized or approved



Current Proposal

- Finalize study with same consultant (Kimley Horn)
- Key Scope Change:On-Street Transit Center
- Identify three potential locations in the downtown corridor
- Work with stakeholders to select best option
- Provide 10% design and cost estimate for completion



Timeline and Budget

- Timeline: 17 weeks
- Present final results at Oct 2023 Board meeting
- Cost: \$75,000
- Source of funds: Savings in current (FY 22/23) budget
