RIDERSHIP



Fixed Route
Fixed Route ridership grew **8%** over 2024 numbers, with **643,208** rides served. While still significantly below pre-COVID levels, it is gratifying to see the upward trend.

BeeLine

BeeLine ridership grew **18%** year-over-year, with Winters seeing the largest growth at **49%**. This was supported by expanded service hours and area, and the addition of a second vehicle in Winters.

Paratransit

Paratransit ridership remained consistent with 2024 numbers. This year saw **28,007** rides served while last year had 27,701.

THE A'S COME TO WEST SACRAMENTO

For the first season in their new Sutter Health Park home base, YoloTD staff collaborated with the A's, Capitol Corridor, SacRT, SACOG, and the City of West Sacramento to develop a **unified strategy and messaging** to encourage people to take public transit to home games.

We also added a **"sweeper service"** to assist with crowding during peak times after games.



FUNDING WINS

SB-125 CYCLE 2

We were awarded **\$3,050,000** from SB-125 Cycle 2 to fund our Short Range Transportation Plan, purchasing new buses and paratransit vehicles, and fleet and facilities maintenance and repairs.

BIKE RACKS FOR FOURTH & HOPE


After YoloTD staff noticed a need for more high-quality bike parking, we helped Fourth & Hope apply for grant funds and **new bike racks will be installed** within the coming year!

AHSC GRANT

In December our partnership with Yolo County Housing and the City of Woodland was awarded a \$27,999,100 grant from the Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities Program to transform a 2.4-acre site in Woodland into an all-electric affordable housing community.

YoloTD's **\$16,050,000** portion funds transportation improvements including new **electric buses, bus shelters, sidewalks, and bike paths.**




YOLO ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION CORRIDORS


In July, the YoloTD Board of Directors and the Yolo County Board of Supervisors **unanimously approved** two segments of the YATC project to advance to the design phase!

Both Boards also reinforced their support for two additional multi-use trails currently under development:
Winters - El Rio Villa and West Sacramento - Clarksburg.


MADISON TO ESPARTO

SHORT RANGE TRANSIT PLAN

Public Input Integrated into SRTP Recommendations

In September and October, YoloTD solicited public input on proposed changes to YoloTD fixed-route and microtransit services as part of the update to our Short-Range Transit Plan.

We received **over 200 survey responses** and spoke with **several hundred people**. The comments were shared with the YoloTD Board of Directors along with the final, cost-neutral recommendations at the December meeting.

YOLO 80 MANAGED LANES

This year, YoloTD Board members and staff invested many hours in partnership with CARTA and Caltrans to advance the Yolo 80 project. Directors Early and Chapman advocated for Yolo priorities, and YoloTD staff and consultants worked behind the scenes preparing technical studies and collaborating with staff from CARTA and other member agencies. Major focus areas this year included:

- Traffic and Revenue study
- Roadside tolling procurement
- VMT mitigation plan
- Equity study

The project is expected to open in the first half of 2028.

WOODLAND TRANSFER POINT

In September, the YoloTD Board of Directors and the Woodland City Council unanimously approved support for a new Transfer Point location in Woodland, on **Main Street between Fifth and Sixth Streets.**

We have applied for Mobility Zones funding from SACOG and hope to move to the new transfer point by mid-2027.

Rural Transportation *Needs*

YoloTD partnered with Health and Human Services to conduct a **farmworker survey** at the Davis and Madison Migrant Centers looking at how residents travel to work and other essential destinations to help identify potential transportation solutions.

This is a first step in our larger Rural Transportation Needs Study, a staff-initiated project.





TRANSIT OPERATIONS CONTRACT

In November we issued the Request for Proposals for qualified firms to provide operations and maintenance of Yolobus fixed route bus service, BeeLine microtransit service, and Yolobus Special ADA paratransit service.

Proposals are due February 6, 2026, and the contract will begin with the selected firm on August 1.

Rural Growth

In June, BeeLine expanded its service hours in Winters, Knights Landing, and Yolo; and added a second vehicle in Winters.



Expanded Service Area

BeeLine expanded its Woodland service area in September. The industrial area in northeast Woodland that has been added includes stops at Fourth & Hope, Yolo Food Bank, Yolo County Office of Education, and the Target Distribution Center.


